

Rules of Organisations and Important Information

<u>SPORTS HORSE BREEDING OF GREAT BRITAIN – (Classes 1-5)</u>

This Show is affiliated to Sports Horse Breeding of Great Britain and all Hunter Classes will be judged under the Society's 2012 Rules.

All Hunter Classes will be judged under the Society's Rules. Classes 1-5 are qualifying events for this year's Horse of the Year Show and only horses registered on the current year Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and owners and riders must be members of the Society. The highest placed unqualified horse in the first four will qualify to enter at the Horse of the Year Show. No horse lower than fourth will qualify. Only horses registered with SHB (GB) and who are also registered on the current year's Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter in Qualifying Classes for Ridden and Working Hunter Championships and the Show Hunter Registration Number must be quoted on all entry forms. Any horse that is entered for a Qualifying Class without first being on the Show Hunter Register cannot subsequently be registered and therefore will not be eligible for entry in any qualifying classes for the season.

Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and owners and riders must be members of the Society. The Society offers a Temporary Registration to competitors who wish to compete at A MAXIMUM OF THREE qualifying shows for a fee of £10 per show (Horses need to be on the Basic Identity Register before they can be on the Show Register or have a Temporary Registration). If the horse subsequently qualifies then they will need to complete their full registration before the Championship Show for which the horse has qualified and the £10 fee will be refunded.

Hunters In Hand (Classes 6 to 8)

All horses entered in the Hunter In Hand classes must be entered in the SHB(GB) Basic Identity Record or Stud Book. Owners and handlers do **not** need to be members to enter or compete.

The Society offers Brood Mare Premiums at selected affiliated shows, but premiums will only be awarded if there are a minimum of three mares forward per class. The premium takes the form of a Service Voucher, the value of which is to be determined from time to time by the Society, awarded at the Judge's discretion to their selection from the monetary prize winners, to be used towards the cost of covering the mare by any SHB (GB) Graded Stallion or Life Approved Premium Stallion that is properly registered for the year of covering. The Service Voucher may be used in either of the two years following the year of that award. The owner must be, or become, a fully paid up member of SHB(GB) in order to be eligible for the award. No mare shall take more than one award per year. NOTE: Grade I and II mares are eligible to be transferred into the SHB(GB) Stud Book.

PERFORMANCE HORSES and PONIES – (Classes 9 to 15)

The classes will be judged on the continental system. The animals will enter the ring individually and will be judged on the triangle.

Method of judging:

- 1. All animals to enter the ring as a class and circle the judge once.
- 2. All animals retire to the collecting ring and enter the ring individually for scrutiny.
- 3. Marks are awarded by the judge. Marks are awarded for conformation, walk, trot and overall manner. At the end of the class, the scores are collated and the animals called back into the ring for presentation.
- 4. Championships to be judged on visual merit (not on the points system).
- 5. These classes are for young athletic horses/ponies that have the conformation and movement to go to the top of their sphere.
- 6. Horse entries do not require to be registered with the SHB (GB).
- 7. All entries in the horse classes must exceed 153cm (15hh approx.) at maturity
- 8. To be eligible, ponies must be registered with a recognised Breed Society, NPS British Riding Pony Studbook, recognised Part-Bred Register, Sports Pony Stud Book or CHAPS (UK).
- 9. All ponies must not exceed 153cm (15hh approx.) at maturity.
- 10. Scottish Sports Horse have offered rosettes for the highest placed registered Scottish Sports Horse in each of these classes who will also qualify for their Mare and Youngstock Championships 2013 at Blair International Horse Trials. Both horse and handler must be registered with SSH prior to taking part in the Championship Final.

BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION – (Classes 16-22)

Held under the rules of the **British Show Horse Association (BSHA)**. Competitors and Horses must be registered or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket. Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older.

Non-members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Novice, Amateur, Young Rider, Home Produced, Working and Open Affiliated classes only, but will not allow entry into RIHS or Horse of the Year Show qualifying classes. Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form from the BSHA website.

The three highest placed prize winners in all Open Affiliated classes will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic Supreme Classes at the National Championship Show 2012. The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Championship rosette for each section.

Rising Stars - Any Exhibitor placed in the first three in Intermediate classes for Show Riding Type or Show Hunter Type may enter the Rising Stars class at the BSHA National Championship Show September 2012. No qualifying card is required.

Classes **16-19 and 21-22** are qualifiers for Horse of the Year Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward and so forth to fifth place. In accordance with BSHA Rules the annual BSHA Horse of the Year Show fee of £15 must have been paid to BSHA before the entry is made if the Exhibitor wishes to qualify. The BSHA Horse of the Year Show fee cannot be paid in retrospect. This fee is not the Horse of the Year Show levy, which goes to Grandstand Media Ltd.

PLEASE NOTE THAT horses competing in the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack and Riding Horse classes at the same show. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

This show is affiliated to the Arab Horse Society (AHS) Affiliation no: 122211. All entries in the Arabian Classes must be registered in their appropriate Stud Book or Register at the closing date of entry and their registration number to be quoted on their entry form. <u>A photocopy of the Registration Certificate must accompany each entry</u>. These classes will be conducted in accordance with the AHS Show Rules. AA/PBA entries must have a minimum of 12.5% Arab blood.

- This is a qualifying show for the British Arabian Championships to be held on 9 September 2012 at Kings Equestrian Centre (<u>www.kingsequestrian.co.uk</u>). In Hand Classes (Pure Bred Geldings Only):

• Senior (Class 27): The highest placed previously unqualified TWO geldings in the first six can qualify. Cards should be produced and signed as above. In mixed age and mixed sex classes the highest placed Pure Bred Gelding of each age can qualify i.e.: one 1 years old, one 2 years old, one 3 years old. They must be previously unqualified and PLACED IN THE FIRST SIX. Cards should be produced and signed as above.

BRITISH SHOW PONY SOCIETY - (Classes 30-46)

This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS) (Affiliation Number 51S/12) and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS classes, whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the constitution and Rules of the BSPS, including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

- This Show is a qualifier for the Horse of the Year Show. Only one pony in each of the three Open SP classes or Open WHP classes or Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Open SHP classes or LR class or FR class or Intermediate SRT, SH and WH classes gualifies, and the highest placed, (not already gualified), from the first five ponies placed in each class will qualify. THE HORSE OF THE YEAR SHOW QUALIFICATION IS SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION FROM THE HORSE OF THE YEAR SHOW.
- The show is a qualifier for the 2013 BSPS Championships Show to be held at Arena UK. The 1st and 2nd prizewinners only in classes 30 - 33 and 38 - 45 and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizewinners only in classes 35 - 37 and 46.
- BSPS Challenge This Show is a qualifier for the BSPS Challenge, the highest placed pony in Lead Rein, First Ridden, Open Show Pony, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Open Show Hunter Pony, Open Working Hunter Pony and the Open Intermediate SRT, SH and WH classes that has not qualified for the BSPS 2012 Horse of the Year Show in the appropriate class, will qualify. If the highest placed pony has already qualified for the BSPS Challenge, the qualification will be awarded to the next eligible pony. If after qualifying for the BSPS Challenge a pony qualifies for the Horse of the Year Show it will forfeit its qualification for the BSPS Challenge.
- BSPS Champions of Champions This Show is a gualifier for the BSPS Champion of Champions, the Champion Mini Show Pony, the Champion Mini WHP, the Champion Open Show Hunter Pony, the Champion Open Show Pony, the Champion Open WHP/WH and The Champion Open Intermediate will qualify.
- <u>BSPS Best Rider</u> This Show is a qualifier for the BSPS Best Rider of the Year. The Best Rider in the Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, 128cms, 138cms and 148cms Show Pony, Open Lead Rein of Hunter Type, 122cm, 133cm, 143cm and 153cm SHP, the 133cms, 143cms, 153cms WHP, the Open Intermediate Show Riding Type, Show Hunter and Working Hunter classes will receive a Card and gualify for the final at the BSPS Summer Championships Show.
- BSPS Blue Riband Pony of The Year This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Blue Riband Pony of the Year, the 1st and prizewinners in the Lead Rein, First Ridden OR Open Show Pony OR Open Show Hunter Pony OR Open Working Hunter Pony classes OR Open Intermediate WH, SRT and SH classes will qualify.

NATIONAL PONY SOCIETY - (Classes 50-55, 60-87)

This show is affiliated to the National Pony Society (NPS). NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books. Partbreds are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Full, Life or Standard members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards will check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Standard members will be required to upgrade to Full membership to enter the final.

a) Silver Medal Rosettes can only be awarded to ponies owned by NPS members.

b) Affiliated shows can select to award a Silver Medal Rosette for the championship in one or more of the following sections:

- Mountain and Moorland In Hand Classes
- Mountain and Moorland Ridden Classes
- Show Pony In Hand Classes
- Show Hunter Pony In Hand Classes

c) The Silver Medal Rosette Championship **must** cover all the classes which are eligible for affiliation, are run under NPS Rules and are judged by NPS approved judges. Schedules must identify the classes eligible for the Silver Medal Rosette Championship. It is not always possible to combine a Silver Medal Rosette Championship with other Championships.

d) Winners of Mountain and Moorland Working Hunter Pony, Leading Rein and First Ridden classes are **not** eligible for Mountain and Moorland Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championships.

e) Foals are **not** eligible for Silver Medal Rosette Championships.

f) The Silver Medal Rosette goes to the Champion, if owned by an NPS member. If the Champion is not owned by an NPS member the Silver Medal Rosette goes to the Reserve if it is owned by an NPS member. Silver Medal Rosette to go no lower than first Reserve (third) provided it is owned by an NPS member. The qualification card goes to the Champion if owned by an NPS member and not already qualified for the final. If the Champion is not owned by an NPS Members or has already qualified then the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion, if owned by an NPS member, unless he has already qualified. Qualification to go no lower than first Reserve.

g) Judges for Silver Medal Rosette Championships must fulfil the following criteria:

- For Show Pony In Hand classes the judge must be on the NPS Show Pony Breeding Panel.
- For Show Hunter Pony In Hand classes the judge must be on the NPS Show Hunter Pony Breeding Panel.
- For Mixed Mountain and Moorland classes the judge must be on the NPS Mixed M&M Panel, except for classes of a single breed when the rule is as follows:

If there are two or more In Hand classes restricted to a single Mountain and Moorland breed, the judge must be on the current Judges Panel of that breed. If there is only one In Hand class restricted to a single breed the judge may be from the breed panel or from the current NPS Mixed M&M Panel. Each section of the Welsh Stud Book is treated as one breed.

h) The judge of the Championship where a Silver Medal Rosette is awarded, and the classes leading up to it, must be on the appropriate NPS Panel. The judge's name must be stated in the show schedule. The Championship may not be judged jointly.

Horse of the Year Show NPS/Baileys Horse Feeds Mountain and Moorland Ridden Pony Championship Qualifier 2012

The following classes are qualifiers for the NPS/Baileys Horse Feeds Ridden Mountain and Moorland Pony of the Year Championship, N.E.C., Birmingham on 3–7 October 2012. This competition is open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, to be registered in the main body of their respective stud books. Part-breds and mares with a living foal born during the current season are not eligible to compete.

To be run as follows:

New Forest and Connemara Fell and Dales Highlands Dartmoor, Exmoor and Shetland

Riders can be of any age with the exception of those riding stallions who must have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Correct riding attire must be worn, spurs are not allowed and whips must not exceed 30". 

Anything NOT covered in the conditions shall be decided by the Organisers in consultation with the Objection Committee and Secretary of any Breed Society or Show Society concerned, or with the Show Veterinary Surgeon, in cases calling for their opinion.
- 3. Committee's Rights: The Committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without assigning any reason.
- 4. Entries: No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the correct fee. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to familiarise themselves with the various Society/Association Rules in operation and entry is only accepted under this condition.
- 5. COMPETITORS CHEQUES NOT HONOURED BY THE BANK will incur bank charges plus 10% of cheque value in administration charges. The Show reserves the right to refuse the entries of any person who has issued dishonoured cheques in this or previous years.
- 6. CHEQUES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED for payment of entries on the day. Only cash payments will be accepted.
- 7. Cancellation of Classes: The Committee reserves the right to divide or cancel, or to amalgamate classes where necessary. Any class receiving five entries or less may be cancelled or prize monies altered at the Committee's discretion.
- 8. Substitution: No nomination entries accepted and no substitution of animals allowed.
- **9.** Forfeiture of Entry fees and charges: Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and all other charges. Should any class/competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any reason, 50% entry fees minus any HOYS levy will be returned where a claim is made within four weeks after the show. No other charges can be refunded.
- 10. In the interests of Welfare, no horses or ponies to be kept in lorries overnight on the showground and no pens/corrals allowed.

General Information, Conditions, Rules and Regulations and Health and Safety Continued...

- 11. Objections: Objections or protests should be made in writing with the Objector's full name and address within 30 minutes of the event concerned and lodged at the Secretary's Office together with the sum of £100. This sum shall be returned if the objection is sustained, or forfeited if the objection is found to be frivolous or incorrect in any detail. The sum of £100 shall be lodged if the objection is on the subject of heights. The Organisers reserve the right to have any entry measured if they think fit.
- 12. Judges: The decisions of all Judges are final. The committee reserve the right to change judges from one event to another or to substitute judges without warning.
- 13. Age: Brood mares must be 4 years old or over. Foals to be at least 3 weeks old on day of Show. All stallions and colts, 2 years old or over, to have NPS or Breed Society Stallion Licence. For Shetland, Exmoor, Highland, Dales, Welsh and Dartmoor, this Rule is extended to 3 years old or over.
- 14. Disease: Should any animal be found to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, it shall be removed from the Showground and stables immediately at the request of the Veterinary Surgeon.
- 15. It is strongly recommended that animals taking part in competition should be vaccinated against Equine Influenza.
- 16. Veterinary Surgeons will provide cover, but exhibitors are responsible for the payment of the fee charged and this must be paid at the time of treatment.
- 17. Control: Any animal not sufficiently under control shall be removed from the Showground immediately at the request of a Judge, Steward, Veterinary Surgeon or anyone else in authority. **Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.**
- 18. Misconduct: Anyone reported to be conducting themselves in a disorderly manner will be asked to leave the Showground.
- 19. Cups and Trophies: Exhibitors successful in winning a cup or trophy will be required to sign for it before removal, and to guarantee its return to the Secretary one month prior to the next Annual Show or by arrangement with the Secretary. A deposit of £25 cash per trophy has been introduced due to the failure of competitors to return trophies.
- 20. Disclaimer of Liability for loss or damage: The Committee and all Show Officials disclaim liability in the following terms:

"In this clause the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Committee and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground. Save for death or personal injury caused to any Exhibitor or to his/her servant or Agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought on to the Showground by the said Exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises. (Save for the aforesaid), the Exhibitor shall indemnify the Committee against all claims, damages and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the Exhibitor, his servants, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the Showground and shall assume full responsibility thereof."

Acceptance of the foregoing conditions shall be a condition of entry.

- 21. Exhibitors are advised to insure against fire and other appropriate risks not only as regards their own property but also against any third party claims.
- 22. Car/Horse Box Parking Conditions: Persons are admitted entry to the show car parks at their own risk and vehicles and their accessories and contents are admitted to and left in the car parks at the owner's risk and while every endeavour is taken to ensure the safety thereof, the Committee will not (save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Committee, its servants or agents), be responsible for personal injury (whether fatal or otherwise), loss or damage to property and any other loss, damage, costs and expenses however caused. Drivers of all vehicles MUST comply with the directions of the Committee, its servants, agents and Parking Attendants.
- 23. The committee reserve the right to reallocate rings as necessary.
- 24. The Directors of the Scottish Horse Show Ltd accept no responsibility whatever for loss, injury or damage to any person, animal or property on the Showground or the approaches thereto.

Health and Safety


25. Riding hats must be worn to the current safety specification for the relevant classes and at all times when mounted.

Every reasonable precaution to ensure the health and safety of everybody has been taken. For these measures to be effective everyone must assist in taking all reasonable precautions to prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of all the officials and stewards.
