A limited number of stables will be available at Kelso Racecourse and at inspected private yards in the local area and must be booked through our convenor, using the enclosed form. These will strictly be on a first come, first served basis.

At many stabling venues (including the racecourse), no horse/pony shall enter unless it's equine influenza vaccinations are up to date in accordance with Jockey Club regulations. Passports must be available for inspection.

Hats must be worn at all times when mounted at either the racecourse or private stabling. All competitors are reminded to be respectful of the yard proprietors/staff and other exhibitors.

Completed forms, together with your cheque payable to "The Scottish Horse Show", should be forwarded to our convenor, Mrs Caroline Nelson (see above) by **14 July 2010** to guarantee a stable. Bookings after this date will be accepted only subject to availability at £60 (racecourse) or £50 (private yard) per stable per night. Bookings are non-transferable.

In the interests of Welfare, no horses or ponies to be kept in lorries overnight on the showground and no pens/corrals allowed.

SPORTS HORSE BREEDING OF GREAT BRITAIN – (Classes 1 to 9)

This Show is affiliated to SPORT HORSE BREEDING OF GREAT BRITAIN and all Hunter Classes will be judged under the Society's Rules.

- Small Hunter, Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight & Working Hunter classes (1,2,3,4 & 5) are qualifying events for this year's **Horse of the Year Show** (6 – 10 October 2010), and only horses registered on the current year Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter. The highest placed horses in the Small Hunter, Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight and Working Hunter classes will qualify to enter at the HOYS if the first placed horse has already qualified, then the second placed horse will qualify. No horse lower than second will qualify, in the Working Hunter Class no horse lower than third will qualify.

Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and owners and riders must be members of the Society. The Society offers a Temporary Registration to competitors who wish to compete at A MAXIMUM OF THREE qualifying shows for a fee of £10 per show (*Horses need to be on the Basic Identity Register before they can be on the Show Register or have a Temporary Registration*). If the horse subsequently qualifies then they will need to complete their full registration before the Championship Show for which the horse has qualified and the £10 fee will be refunded.

Hunters In-Hand (Classes 6 to 9)

All horses entered in the Hunter In-Hand classes must be entered in the SHB(GB) Basic Identity Register or Stud Book. Owners and handlers do **not** need to be members to enter or compete. A Brood Mare Premium is offered in Class 6 provided there are a minimum of 3 Brood Mares forward. The Premium takes the form of a Service Voucher, the value of which is to be determined from time to time by the Society, awarded at the judges discretion to their selection from the monetary prize winners, to be used towards the cost of covering the mare by any SHB(GB) Graded Stallion or Life Approved Premium Stallion.

BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION – (Classes 17 to 22)

This Show is affiliated to the BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION and the Hack, Riding Horse and Cob classes will be held under the Rules and jurisdiction of the British Show Horse Association. These classes are restricted to animals registered with the Association.

- Classes 17 -22 are qualifiers for Horse of the Year Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward and so forth to fifth place. In accordance with BSHA rules the annual **BSHA HOYS** fee of £15 must be paid to the BSHA **before** the entry is made if the exhibitor wishes to qualify. The **BSHA HOYS** fee cannot be paid in retrospect. This fee is not the HOYS levy, which goes to Grandstand Media Ltd.
- The first, second and third placed horse in the Open Hack, Cob and Riding Horse classes (17 to 22) will qualify for the Classic Supreme classes at the British Show Horse Association National Championship Show on 10 & 11 September 2010.
- The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosettes in each open class and a Championship rosette for each section.
- The highest placed Amateur Home Produced exhibit in all HOYS qualifying classes will receive a Blue Chip rosette and £5 money-off voucher. This rosette winner will need to contact Sarah Butler (details on reverse of rosette) to claim. A maximum of one rosette per season at a HOYS qualifier. The award will then be passed down the line.
- Virbac Animal Health, manufacturers of leading horse wormer brands Equimax and Eraquell, will issue the HOYS Cob qualifier in each class a qualification rosette and card, this will not be presented in the ring but will be forwarded along with a confirmation of qualification from the BSHA.

This is a qualifier for the BSHA 'Martin Wood Supreme In Hand Breeding Championship to be held at National Championships at Addington on 10th and 11th September 2010. Champion and Reserve from the In Hand Light Horse section will qualify. £1,000 prize to Champion at the Finals

At Affiliated Shows no horse may compete in Hack & Riding Horse Classes at the same show, nor may a horse compete in a Hunter class if it has also competed as a Hack or Riding Horse.

BRITISH SHOW PONY SOCIETY - (Classes 34 to 50)

This Show is affiliated to the BSPS (Affiliation No: 51S/2010) and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS classes, whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the constitution and Rules of the BSPS, including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

- This Show is a qualifier for the **Horse of the Year Show (HOYS)**. Only one pony in each of the three Open SP classes or Open WHP classes or Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Open SHP classes or LR class or FR class or Intermediate SRT, SH and WH classes qualifies, and the highest placed, (not already qualified), from the first five ponies placed in each class will qualify. THE HOYS QUALIFICATION IS SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION FROM THE HOYS. (**Owners and riders must be BSPS members and the pony registered with the BSPS to compete in these classes**).
- This Show is a qualifier for the 2010 BSPS Championships Show to be held at Arena UK, Grantham on 25th to 28th August 2010. The 1st and 2nd prizewinners only in Classes 34-37 & 42-49 and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizewinners in Classes 39-41 & 50 will qualify for the BSPS Championships provided the animal is registered in accordance with Rules 23 and 28 and ridden by a BSPS member.
- **BSPS Challenge** This Show is a qualifier for the BSPS Challenge, the highest placed pony in Lead Rein, First Ridden, Open Show Pony, Open Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Open Show Hunter Pony, Open Working Hunter Pony and the Open Intermediate SRT, SH and WH classes that has not qualified for the 2010 Horse of the Year Show in the appropriate class, will qualify. If the highest placed pony has already qualified for the BSPS Challenge, the qualification will be awarded to the next eligible pony. If after qualifying a pony qualifies for the Horse of the Year Show it will forfeit its qualification for the CHALLENGE.
- **BSPS Champions of Champions** This Show is a qualifier for the BSPS Champion of Champions, the Champion Mini Show Pony, the Champion Open Show Pony, the Champion SHP & the Champion Open WHP/WH will qualify.
- **BSPS Best Rider** This Show is a qualifier for the BSPS Best Rider of the Year. The Best Rider in the Lead Rein, First Ridden, 128cms, 138cms & 148cms Show Pony, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, 122cm, 133cm, 143cm & 153cm SHP, the 133cms, 143cms, 153cms & Int WHP, the Open Intermediate Show Riding Type & Show Hunter classes will receive a Card and qualify for the final at the BSPS Summer Championships Show.
- **BSPS Blue Riband** This show is a qualifier for the BSPS Blue Riband Pony of the Year, the 1st and 2nd prizewinners in the Lead Rein, First Ridden, Open Show Pony, Open Show Hunter Pony, Open Working Hunter Pony classes will qualify and the 1st, 2nd and 3rd in the Intermediate WH, SRT and SH classes.

ARAB HORSE SOCIETY – (Classes 27 to 33)

This show is affiliated to the Arab Horse Society (AHS) Affiliation no: 074111. All entries in the Arabian Classes must be registered in their appropriate Stud Book/Register of the AHS by the closing date of entry and their registration number to be quoted on their entry form. **A photocopy of the Registration certificate should accompany each entry.** These classes will be conducted in accordance with the Show Rules and Regulations of the AHS. AA/PBA entries must have a minimum of 12.5% Arab blood.

Ridden Classes:

- Open to registered Pure Bred Arabian Stallions, Mares and Geldings 4 years and over, and to be judged as Ridden Horses. Novices are eligible. The highest placed previously unqualified horse in the first six can qualify and the exhibitor must produce his/her card at the end of the class for the judge to sign. (Class 31)
In-Hand Classes (Pure Bred Geldings Only):
- Senior (Class 27): The highest placed previously unqualified TWO geldings in the first six can qualify. Cards should be produced and signed as above.
- Junior (Class 30): In mixed age and mixed sex classes the highest placed Pure Bred Gelding of each age can qualify ie: one 1 yr old, one 2 yr old, one 3 yr old. They must be previously unqualified and PLACED IN THE FIRST SIX. Cards should be produced and signed as above.
- **CHERIF** – *Ridden qualifying competition open to registered Anglo and Part-bred Arab stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, any height* - This is a qualifying show for the **CHERIF CHAMPIONSHIP 2010**. The final will be held at the Cherif Championship Show, Addington Manor Equestrian Centre, Addington, Bucks on 15th September 2010. Full details and qualifying cards at £20 each (payable to Cherif Championship) from: Miss L Temple, The Stables, Ashton Gifford Lane, Codford, Wiltshire, BA12 0JX. Please state the name and accurate height of horse/pony. SAE please and contact telephone number.

NATIONAL PONY SOCIETY - (Classes 65 to 93)

This show is affiliated to the National Pony Society (NPS).

- If six or more of one breed is forward in the In-Hand M&M, these classes will be split by breed.
- **Silver Medal Rosettes are offered by the NPS for the best registered pony in the M&M In-Hand, Show Pony In-Hand & Show Hunter Pony Breeding Sections.** To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the Champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the Owner of the Champion pony is not a Member, or the Owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in August 2011.
- ❖ **NPS / Kilmannan Stud M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship.** Qualifiers are entitled to compete in either the NPS/Kilmannan Stud M&M In-hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in Malvern, or at the Championship Show in Scotland. All ponies must be registered in the Main Body of their respective M&M Stud Books. Part-breds are not eligible.
- ❖ **NPS/The Boyles Family Show Pony In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship**
- ❖ **NPS/Bankswood Stud Show Hunter Pony Breeding In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship**
 - NPS Silver Medal Rosettes will be awarded to the best Registered In-Hand Show Pony & best Registered In-Hand SHP (provided the exhibitor is an adult/standard NPS member) but if that pony has previously qualified then the Reserve Champion may receive the qualification card (provided that the exhibitor is an adult/standard NPS member). Members will be required to upgrade to Adult/Showing to enter the Final.
 - Ponies must be registered in the NPS Riding Pony Stud Book, Register or Appendix, the GSB, the AHSB, AASB or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Books. Part-breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS Stud Book, Register or Appendix. Ponies must be plaited.
 - Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the relevant Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Champ Show in Malvern next year (August 2011) providing they send to the NPS Secretariat, the relevant entry fee and qualification card provided with the Silver Medal Rosette.
 - To be judged within their relevant sections

NPS SCOTLAND FINALS Blair Castle International Horse Trials, Friday 27th August 2010

1. Ponies may only qualify **once** for each NPS Scotland Competition Final.
2. All Mountain & Moorland Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective stud book. Part bred and X registered ponies and Eriskays are not eligible.
3. Qualification can go as far down the line as necessary, except the in-hand M. & M. section where qualification may go to 3rd in the championship
4. Entry for the Finals can only be made by sending the official card, duly signed by the judge at the time of qualifying, with your entry form.
5. The **OWNER** must be or become a member of NPS Scotland before entering the Finals.
6. All ridden ponies must be shown off the lead rein
7. Max. Height for HP/RP is 153cm or 15 hh – foal classes excluded
8. The Final will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on 27th August 2010.

NPS Scotland Open M&M WHP Championship

The 3 highest placed ponies in each class (classes 51-53) not already qualified, will qualify for the Final

NPS Scotland/Baileys Horse Feeds Open Ridden M&M Championship

The 2 highest placed ponies in each class (classes 54-60) not already qualified, will qualify for the Final

NPS Scotland/Clarendon Planning and Development M&M In-Hand Championship

The Champion & Reserve Champion in all Mixed M&M or Breed Classes (classes 65-68, 69-72, 73-76, 77-80) will qualify for the Final

NPS Scotland/Dignity Caring Funeral Services UK Open In-Hand Riding Pony/Hunter Pony Championship

The 2 highest placed ponies in the Open In-Hand Riding Pony or Hunter Pony Classes (foal classes excluded) (classes 81-87, 88-93) will qualify for the Final

NPS AREA 4 NORTH OF ENGLAND SHOW

Roseberry Northern Breeders In-Hand Championship

- The Champion and Reserve Champions from the **Show Pony Breeding** and the **Hunter Pony Breeding** Sections along with the **Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion Mountain & Moorland In-hand ponies**, qualify for the Roseberry Northern Breeders In Hand Championship to be held at the NPS Area 4 North of England Show, Great Yorkshire Showground, Harrogate on Monday 30th August 2010. NB The Champions and Reserve Champions will qualify. Qualifiers do not have to be Members of the NPS. *Qualifying cards will be presented.*

MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND MINI, RIDDEN & WHP – (Classes 51 to 62)

- The Mountain and Moorland Working Hunter Pony Classes (51-53), The Ridden Mountain and Moorland Classes (54-60), The M&M Lead Rein & First Ridden Classes (61 & 62) are qualifiers for the above Championship at the Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 6th – 10th October 2010.
- **Please note: Ponies that qualify for these Championships at HOYS 2010 must hold a valid JMB Full Height or Annual Certificate, a copy of which must be enclosed at the time of entry to HOYS. JMB certificates are not required to enter this qualifier.**

Carrs BMW Mountain & Moorland Pony of the Year Championship

- This competition is open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, to be registered in the main body of their respective stud books. Part-breds and mares with a living foal born during the current season are not eligible to compete.
- Riders can be of any age with the exception of those riding stallions who must have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Correct riding attire must be worn, spurs are not allowed and whips must not exceed 30". Riders must be members of their respective breed society, NPS, Ponies (UK) or BSPS.

Leading Rein & First Ridden Mountain & Moorland Championships

- These classes are open to M&M mares and geldings, four years old and over, registered in the main body of their respective Stud Books.
- To be run under the rules of the National Pony Society.

- Lead Rein Ponies not to exceed 122cms (12hh). Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have attained their 9th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
- First Ridden Ponies not to exceed 128cm (12.2hh). Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have attained their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

The Above Ridden, Lead Rein & First Ridden classes will all be judged as follows:

- Judges may only judge one qualifier during the current year, marks will be awarded as follows:
Show, freedom of action: 50 max Breed, type, conformation: 50 max
- Where more than 20 entrants are forward in each class, the class may be split. The judges should split the class according to the circumstances on the day.
- Each section must be marked and the top five ponies with the highest marks (from each section) should go forward to a final judging. The marks should not be displayed at this point and no rosettes awarded.
- For the final judging the top ponies should be invited back into the ring and lined up in any order. No further show will be given.
- The judges should then refer to their original marks. In the case of equality, the pony with the highest show, freedom of action mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at the point, then the judges' decision will be final.
- The highest placed animal (not already qualified) from the first three in the final judging will qualify for the Horse of the Year Show, 2010, subject to verification of qualification from the HOYS office.

General Information, Conditions, Rules and Regulations

It is important to read the undernoted:

1. Exhibitors/Competitors must make themselves conversant with the General Rules and Regulations printed in the Schedule and Exhibitors/Competitors will be assumed to be fully aware of the contents thereof.
2. Any questions arising out of the Show shall be referred to the Conditions for settlement. Anything NOT covered in the conditions shall be decided by the Organisers in consultation with the Objection Committee and Secretary of any Breed Society or Show Society concerned, or with the Show Veterinary Surgeon, in cases calling for their opinion.
3. Committee's Rights: The Committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without assigning any reason.
4. Entries: No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the correct fee. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to familiarise themselves with the various Society/Association Rules in operation and entry is only accepted under this condition.
5. COMPETITORS CHEQUES NOT HONOURED BY THE BANK will incur bank charges plus 10% of cheque value in administration charges. The Show reserves the right to refuse the entries of any person who has issued dishonoured cheques in this or previous years.
6. No late entries will be accepted under any circumstances, unless a horse/pony qualified for a Regional final or for Classes which qualify for this Show after the closing date.
7. Cancellation of Classes: The Committee reserves the right to divide or cancel, or to amalgamate classes where necessary. Any class receiving five entries or less may be cancelled or prize monies altered at the Committee's discretion.
8. Substitution: No nomination entries accepted and no substitution of animals allowed.
9. Forfeiture of Entry fees and charges: Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and all other charges. Should any class/competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any reason, 50% entry fees will be returned where a claim is made within four weeks after the show. No other charges can be refunded.
10. In the interests of Welfare, no horses or ponies to be kept in lorries overnight on the showground and no pens/corrals allowed.
11. Objections: Objections or protests should be made in writing with the Objector's full name and address within 30 minutes of the event concerned and lodged at the Secretary's Office together with the sum of £100. This sum shall be returned if the objection is sustained, or forfeited if the objection is found to be frivolous or incorrect in any detail. The sum of £100 shall be lodged if the objection is on the subject of heights. The Organisers reserve the right to have any entry measured if they think fit.
12. Judges: The decisions of all Judges are final. The committee reserve the right to change judges from one event to another or to substitute judges without warning.
13. Age: Brood mares must be 4 years old or over. Foals to be at least 3 weeks old on day of Show. All stallions and colts, 2 years old or over, to have NPS or Breed Society Stallion Licence. For Shetland, Exmoor, Highland, Dales, Welsh and Dartmoor, this Rule is extended to 3 years old or over.
14. Disease: Should any animal be found to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, it shall be removed from the Showground and stables immediately at the request of the Veterinary Surgeon.
15. It is strongly recommended that animals taking part in competition should be vaccinated against Equine Influenza.
16. Veterinary Surgeons will provide cover, but exhibitors are responsible for the payment of the fee charged and this must be paid at the time of treatment.
17. Control: Any animal not sufficiently under control shall be removed from the Showground immediately at the request of a Judge, Steward, Veterinary Surgeon or anyone else in authority. **Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.**
18. Misconduct: Anyone reported to be conducting themselves in a disorderly manner will be asked to leave the Showground.
19. Cups and Trophies: Exhibitors successful in winning a cup or trophy will be required to sign for it before removal, and to guarantee its return to the Secretary one month prior to the next Annual Show or by arrangement with the Secretary.
20. Disclaimer of Liability for loss or damage: The Committee and all Show Officials disclaim liability in the following terms:
"In this clause the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Committee and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground. Save for death or personal injury caused to any Exhibitor or to his/her servant or Agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought on to the Showground by the said Exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises. (Save for the aforesaid), the Exhibitor shall indemnify the Committee against all claims, damages and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the Exhibitor, his servants, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the Showground and shall assume full responsibility thereof."
Acceptance of the foregoing conditions shall be a condition of entry.

21. Exhibitors are advised to insure against fire and other appropriate risks not only as regards their own property but also against any third party claims.
22. *Car/Horse Box Parking Conditions:* Persons are admitted entry to the show car parks at their own risk and vehicles and their accessories and contents are admitted to and left in the car parks at the owner's risk and while every endeavour is taken to ensure the safety thereof, the Committee will not (save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Committee, its servants or agents), be responsible for personal injury (whether fatal or otherwise), loss or damage to property and any other loss, damage, costs and expenses however caused. Drivers of all vehicles **MUST** comply with the directions of the Committee, its servants, agents and Parking Attendants.
23. The committee reserve the right to reallocate rings as necessary.
24. The Directors of the Scottish Horse Show Ltd accept no responsibility whatever for loss, injury or damage to any person, animal or property on the Showground or the approaches thereto.

Health & Safety

25. Riding hats must be worn to the current safety specification for the relevant classes.

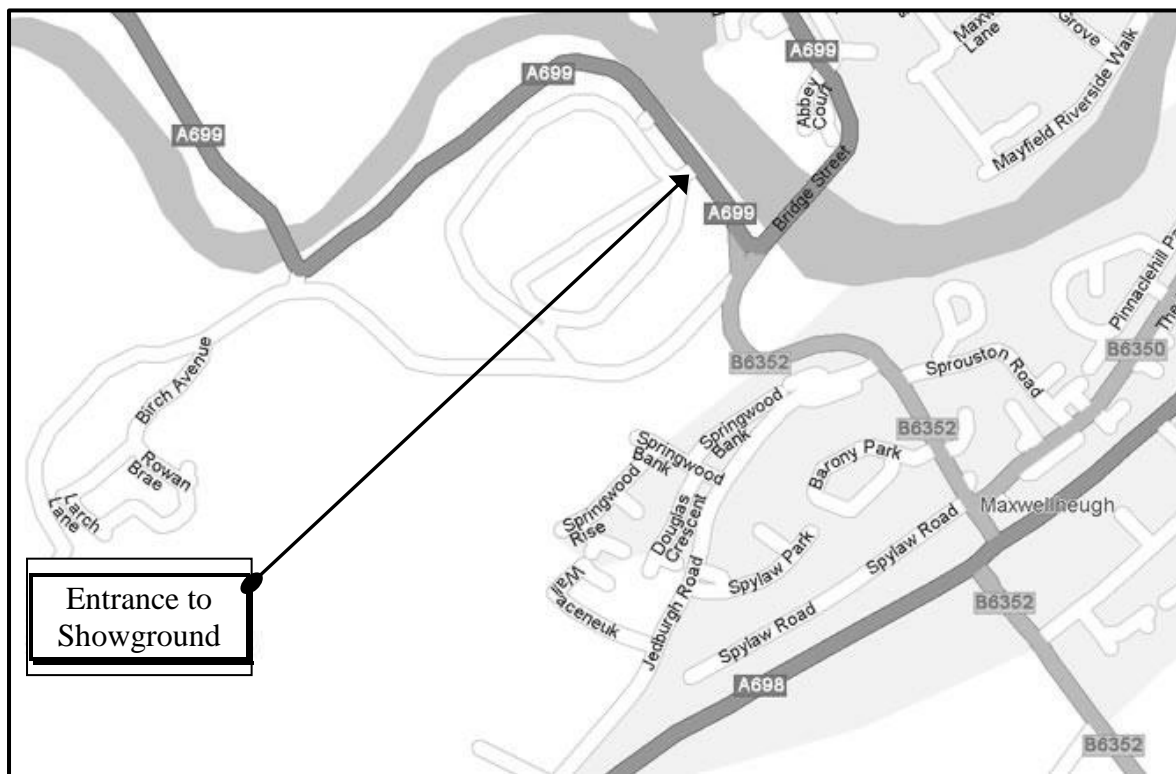
